



How to Setup Clearmail on Thunderbird


- ⇒ In Mozilla Thunderbird, from the Tools menu select **Account** Settings.
Select on create a new **Email** account



- ⇒ Click on “**skip this and use my existing email**”



⇒ Enter your **name**, **e-mail address**, **password** and continue.





⇒ Select your **SSL, Authentication** and **username** as provided below and click on **done**.




